

By better understanding the challenges we face in conserving water, the more prepared we'll be to supply water in the future.






Earth Hour Day

Aarti Kanojia and her family belong to a middle-class family with 2 kids, Kavya (7) and Yuvraj (5), and were living a normal life. Aarti Kanojia met with an unfortunate accident that caused an injury to her leg. This stopped her from working and she lost her source of income. Aarti's husband works at a dispensary as a compounder and earns just Rs.7000 per month, that hardly supports their daily expenses. Their children's school fees remained unpaid. Aarti started getting notices from her children's school stating that her children will be expelled if the fees are not paid.

Help a mother raise funds for her little angel's treatment

Amerah Efra Denson is an eight-month-old baby girl born with a Neural Tube Defect involving lumbar Meningomyelocele type 2 Arnold Chiari Malformation and urinary problems. Due to this disorder, when Amerah was born, her legs were numb, and she could not move her legs as a healthy newborn would. She has already undergone two surgeries for the repair of meningomyelocele and ventriculoperitoneal shunting. The baby's father is a fisherman with a monthly income of only Rs. 3,500/-. Her mother is a homemaker. The estimated cost for her treatment is Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Only).

To recover and move like a normal baby, she needs to continue physiotherapy for another two years. Amerah's family needs your help to make her recovery possible.

Dialysis and Ventilator Support for Vihansh is the only way he lives! Please help!



Vihansh Butti, a four-year-old is tormented by severe disorders. Doctors discovered that Vihansh is suffering from Kidney Failure and AIHA (a rare type of anaemia) after a few checkups. He was admitted and treated at the same hospital initially, but due to worsening symptoms, he was shifted to Rainbow Children's Hospital, Hyderabad.

To add to his despair, after being on ventilator support for one week, Vihansh suffered a cardiac arrest due to which his brain is partially damaged. Kidney Failure and Brain damage have wrecked his life. The doctors have suggested Dialysis and continued ventilator support for his survival. The estimated cost for his treatment is Rs. 8,00,000/- (Rupees Eight Lakhs Only). His parents cannot afford this huge amount as Mr Rajashekar Butti lost his job due to lockdown. This treatment is the only chance for Vihansh to survive.
